<b>Lyndon Baines Johnson</b>	VP under Kennedy, tough negotiator, Civil Rights advocate
<b>Great Society</b>	War on Poverty to make American a better, fairer place
<b>Medicare/Medicaid</b>	Healthcare for the elderly and disabled Healthcare for the poor and disabled
<b>Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD)</b>	Affordable housing and fair housing laws <b>(HUD)</b>
<b>Economic Opportunity Acts</b>	Programs to help the poor... <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ <b>Head Start</b>- early child education</li> <li>✓ <b>Food stamps</b></li> <li>✓ <b>Job Corps</b></li> <li>✓ <b>PBS</b></li> </ul>

<b>Vietnam</b>	<b>Vocabulary</b>
<b>Agent Orange</b>	Herbicide used by US as part of its Vietnam warfare
<b>Counterculture</b>	Way of life/attitudes opposed to social norm
<b>Credibility Gap</b>	Public distrust of statements made by the government.
<b>Domino Theory</b>	If a nation falls to communism, nearby nations will also fall
<b>Draft</b>	Men that filled vacancies in the armed forces which could not be filled through voluntary means.
<b>Geneva Accords</b>	Divided Vietnam into communist North and non-communist South
<b>Guerilla warfare</b>	Armed civilians who use ambush, sabotage, hit-and-run to fight a larger/less-mobile traditional military.

<b>Gulf of Tonkin Resolution</b>	Allowed LBJ broad military power) to bomb North Vietnam. (granted LBJ broad military power)
<b>Ho Chi Minh</b>	Communist leader of Vietminh; ended French rule in Vietnam.
<b>Ho Chi Minh Trail</b>	Network of trails along Laos, Cambodia, & Vietnam that North Vietnamese used to supply Vietcong
<b>Kent State</b>	National Guardsmen fired on anti-war protesters at a university, killing 4
<b>Napalm</b>	Flammable liquid used in warfare
<b>Ngo Dinh Diem</b>	Non-communist leader in South Vietnam supported by the US, but ruled as a ruthless dictator
<b>Pentagon Papers</b>	1971; leaked to the press; revealed US had not been honest about its intentions in the Vietnam War.
<b>Roy Benavidez</b>	Army Master Sergeant from TX; Vietnam War hero who saved the lives of several men in a battle
<b>Self-Immolation</b>	Act of Buddhist monks setting themselves on fire as a form of protest against religious persecution
<b>Silent Majority</b>	Group who do not express their opinions publicly
<b>Tet Offensive</b>	1968 massive surprise attack by the Viet Cong on South Vietnamese towns
<b>Tinker v. Des Moines</b>	Supreme Court ruled students had right in school to wear armbands to protest war (freedom of speech)
<b>Vietcong</b>	North Vietnamese Soldiers in South Vietnam
<b>Viet Minh</b>	Led fight for Vietnamese independence from French rule; leader Ho Chi Minh
<b>Vietnamization</b>	Nixon's strategy for getting US out of Vietnam; US gradual withdrawal, replacing with S Vietnam forces.

<b>War Powers Act</b>	Law enacted in 1973 limiting a President's right to send troops into battle without consulting Congress.
<b>Woodstock</b>	Music festival of 400,000 people, dairy farm in NY; peaceful anti-war protest
<b>26<sup>th</sup> Amendment</b>	Lowered the voting age to 18
