Obamacare; U.S. federal law by President Obama providing healthcare



Al Qaeda

Extremist Muslim terrorists responsible for 9/11, led by Osama Bin Laden; financed by the Taliban





Barack Obama

44th President of the U.S. (2009-2017); first African American to hold office; controversial healthcare program; Osama Bin Laden found and killed



Bill Clinton

42nd President of the U.S. (1993-2001); built up a strong economy, signed the NAFTA agreement; known for his Monica Lewinsky scandal, impeached, but not convicted




Bill Gates

Co-found of Microsoft (software company); philanthropist



Contract with America

Republicans (1990s) signed, promising their support of a balanced budget amendment, term limits for members of Congress, and a middle-class tax cut





Donald Trump

45th President of the U.S. (2017-2021); Russian collusion witch hunt; Border Wall; impeached twice, but not convicted; met with Kim Jong-Un of North Korea; 2020 election questions; COVID; January 6th



George H.W. Bush

41st President of the United States (1989-1993); Cold War ends during his term, he made promises to NOT raise taxes; President during the Persian Gulf War



George W. Bush

43rd President of the U.S. (2001-2009); 9/11 attacks spurred war with Afghanistan in search of Osama Bin Laden; Iraq war with Saddam Hussein over biochemical weapons (2nd war with Iraq)



Globalization

Businesses expanding their markets throughout the world creating international trade



Hurricane Katrina

2005 hurricane in New Orleans, damage from Florida to Texas, levees broke and flooded 80% of the city





Internet

Worldwide network originally developed by the U.S. Department of Defense that links computers and allows immediate communications



Iraq War

2nd war with Iraq; U.S. coalition forces invade Iraq because Saddam Hussein would not allow inspectors inside the country to inspect for biochemical warfare





Joe Biden

46th President of the U.S., sworn into office in 2021; many executive orders (question of constitutionality); COVID; Border immigration surge; Biden-nomics; oldest president, 78 years old



North American Free Trade Agreement

(NAFTA) 1993 agreement between U.S., Canada, and Mexico to reduce tariffs and taxes on imports between these countries (free trade zone); signed by President Clinton




Office of Homeland Security

Government agency created after 9/11 to protect and respond to terrorist threats, national disasters, and man-made accidents

World-wide T.V. evangelist; Presidential spiritual advisor



Patriot Act/Anti-Terrorism Bill


U.S. law in response to 9/11 attacks; gave the U.S. government authority to monitor communications (phone calls, emails, etc.) of suspected terrorist threats



1st Persian Gulf War

U.S. coalition forces war on Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein who invaded Kuwait (1990); quickly defeated; **Desert Shield:** protect Saudi Arabia oil fields; **Desert Storm:** U.S. coalition push Iraqis out of Kuwait





Robert Johnson

Formed Black Entertainment Television (BET); the first television station aimed at a black audience; first black-owned company on the New York Stock Exchange



Ross Perot

Texas billionaire third party candidate and split the Republican vote, which gave way for democrat Clinton as President



Saddam Hussein

Evil dictator of Iraq, invaded Kuwait in 1990; Persian Gulf War, U.S. fights a second war with Iraq in the early 2000s over non-disclosure of biochemical weapons



September 11, 2001

Islamic terrorists Al Qaeda hijacked 4 planes; two crashed into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center; one into the Pentagon





Sonia Sotomayor

First *Hispanic* female Supreme Court Justice; appointed by President Obama



Taliban

Islamic holy warriors in Afghanistan; extremists; suppression of women; U.S. helped push out Soviets; turned on U.S. supporting Al Qaeda with 9/11



Terrorism

Use of violence or threats to cause fear in a group of people and force them to act in a certain way



Third Way

Bill Clinton's political policy, a blend of conservative economic policies and liberal social policies



War on Terror

Global war on terrorism, international military campaign started after the 9/11 attacks on the U.S.



War with Afghanistan

U.S. coalition forces invade Afghanistan in search of Al Qaeda, Osama Bin Laden, Taliban for the 9/11 attacks; **Operation Enduring Freedom**





World Trade Organization

Promotes trade and economic development; some people oppose it claiming it makes decisions with little public input - promotes globalization
