UNITED NATIONS PRESENTS **UNIVERSAL DECLARATION OF HUMAN RIGHTS ARTICLE I PRFAMRIF**

Whereas recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal and inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world.

Whereas disregard and contempt for human rights have resulted in barbarous acts which have outraged the conscience of mankind, and the advent of a world in which human beings shall enjoy freedom of speech and belief and freedom from fear and want has been proclaimed as the highest aspiration of the common people,

Whereas it is essential, if man is not to be compelled to have recourse, as a last resort, to rebellion against tyranny and oppression, that human rights should be protected by the rule of law,

Whereas it is essential to promote the development of friendly relations between nations,

Whereas the peoples of the United Nations have in the Charter reaffirmed their faith in fundamental human rights, in the dignity and worth of the human person and in the equal rights of men and women and have determined to promote social progress and better standards of life in larger freedom,

Whereas Member States have pledged themselves to achieve, in co-operation with the United Nations, the promotion of universal respect for and observance of human rights and fundamental freedoms.

Whereas a common understanding of these rights and freedoms is of the greatest importance for the full realization of this pledge, All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood.

Everyone is entitled to all the rights and freedoms set forth in this Declaration, without distinction of any kind, such as race, colour, sex, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, property, birth or other status. Furthermore, no distinction shall be made on the basis of the political,

jurisdictional or international status of the country or territory to which a person belongs.

Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.

No one shall be held in slavery or servitude; slavery and the slave trade shall be prohibited in all their forms

No one shall be subjected to torture or to cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment.

ARTICI F XII


No one shall be subjected to arbitrary interference with his privacy, family, home or correspondence, nor to attacks upon his honour and reputation. Everyone has the right to the protection of the law against such interference or attacks.


Everyone has the right to a nationality. No one shall be arbitrarily deprived of his nationality nor denied the right to change his nationality.

Everyone has the right to rest and leisure






INDEPENDENCE

UNITED NATIONS



- <u>Members of the United Nations</u> which have...responsibilities for the administration of territories whose peoples have not yet attained a full measure of self-government recognize the principle that the interests of the inhabitants of these territories are **paramount**:
 - to ensure, with <u>due respect for the culture</u> of the peoples concerned, their political, economic, social, and educational advancement, their <u>just treatment</u>, and their <u>protection against abuses</u>;
 - to <u>develop self-government</u>, to take due account of the political aspirations of the peoples, and to assist them in the progressive development of their free political institutions







The MANDATE SYSTEM established after WWI, was phased out after WWII. With the end of the British/French controlled MANDATES, new states were created in the Middle East. Below are the stories of two of these nations.
